#### SERIES BACKGROUND & DESCRIPTION:

The series was created by Aleen Leslie for an actor who wound up being unavailable when the series was sold and first reached the airwaves. That actor, Helen Mack, later directed the series for most of its run.

A Date With Judy premiered in 1941 as a Summer replacement for Bob Hope. There were also Summer runs in 1942 (again for Hope) and 1943 (this time for Eddie Cantor), before the series was incorporated into the regular NBC lineup in January, 1944. It remained in the same NBC time slot, Tuesdays at 8:30 PM ET, for five years (with the exception of Summer, 1948) before leaving the air in January, 1949. It returned to the air in October, 1949 on ABC before finally leaving the radio airwaves in May, 1950.

A Date With Judy was one of a trio of radio series that started in the 1940's that focused on the trials and tribulations of a female teenage lead character and their impacts on family and friends. The other two series were Junior Miss and Meet Corliss Archer. The radio series also served as the basis for a 1948 motion picture and a 1951-53 television series.

The series setting was in an unnamed Ohio town. The Foster family was middle class. Judy, the central character, was of high school age. The Father, Melvin Foster, owned a can company. Dora Foster, the Mother, was a homemaker. Her younger brother, Randolph, was wiser than his years and

well aware of the foibles of his family members and often realized the results of their actions before anyone else.

Most of the antics revolved around Judy and her circle of friends especially her boyfriend, Oogie Pringle and her best girlfriend, Mitzi Hoffman. There was stereotypical mis-communication between Judy and her parents that left Mr. and Mrs. Foster sometimes amused and often bewildered.

## **OPENING:**

The announcer stated in the opening of many episodes, "Judy Foster, the loveable teenage girl who is close to all our hearts."

Many episodes opened with a telephone conversation involving the central character, Judy Foster and Oogie or one of her girlfriends or a member of the Foster family.

#### LOG:

All Broadcast Dates, and Titles are from the Series Scripts. When ever possible, Broadcast Dates, and Titles have been verified using other sources. All broadcast times are for the Eastern Time Zone.

## Re-Use of Previously Aired Scripts:

At least 48 scripts were reused on the series. Over three-quarters of the scripts from the three Summer Replacement runs were later reused. Roughly a third of the thirty episodes of the ABC run utilized previously used scripts.

NOTE: These were New Productions of Previously Used Scripts and were NOT Rebroadcasts of Previously Recorded Electronic Transcriptions.

## **Episode Titles:**

As with many radio series, <u>episode titles were not mentioned during the broadcast.</u> Collectors have made up their own titles; some episodes have more than a half dozen collector-assigned titles. Additionally, Armed Forces Radio Service assigned plot line-related titles when they ran parts of the series.

This log uses episode titles from the scripts. Each episode title, no matter how short, has a direct relationship to its episode plot line.

## **Episodes in Circulation and Correcting Episode Titles and Dates:**

Due to the efforts of Old-Time Radio collector/dealer, Jerry Haendiges, a very large number of *A Date With Judy* episodes have recently come into circulation with more to follow. Jerry and I have compared our primary source episode information to ensure that the episodes are correctly dated and titled. We have listened to each of these newly found shows and determined their correct title and broadcast date. (Whenever possible, Broadcast Dates and Titles have been verified using both Primary and Secondary Sources.)

Transcription discs for four episodes are damaged beyond repair and recordings cannot be made from them.

Only one of two transcription discs are available for 18 episodes. Therefore, only partial recordings are available for these episodes. These episodes are identified in the **LOG**.

Most episodes from other sources were incorrectly titled and some also are undated or incorrectly dated. In this log, common collector-assigned titles are listed following the actual titles in a San Serif Font.

Full and partial episodes and rehearsal recordings that are currently known to be in circulation are highlighted.

## Lack of Consecutive Episode Numbers:

A Date With Judy had five distinct segments:

three Summer Replacement runs on NBC,

- a lengthy extended run on NBC, and
- a 30 episode run on ABC.

Each segment had its own script episode numbering sequence. Therefore, no consecutive episode numbers are listed in this log.

## End Date of Series:

The *New York Times* lists *A Date With Judy* as airing on 05/11/1950, 05/18/1950, & 05/25/1950; the *Los Angeles Times* and *Washington Post* do not have listings for these dates. As there are No Scripts after 05/04/1950 and other major newspapers consulted have no listings for the series after that date, <u>I believe that the *New York Times* radio listings are in error and that the final episode of *A Date With Judy* was broadcast on 05/04/1950.</u>
